- 1. Training young persons in habits of observation, obedience, and self- reliance through training in wood-craft.
- 2. Inculcating loyalty and thoughtfulness for others by instruction and by giving service to others.
- 3. Teaching young persons services useful to the public and handicrafts useful to themselves.
- 4. Developing mental and physical powers of the individual through wholesome social contacts and activities.
- 5. Leading the individual to develop spiritual and social values by example and association.

Why is Revering/Rangering necessary?

Scout Movement takes care of the person right from his childhood. In the age of materialism and technological and scientific advancement it is very essential to' reap the advantages of the advances made in different fields as well as to make the youth aware of the social and cultural values so that he/she may cultivate good values and does not fall prey to the adverse ones. Earnest care is taken to instill all such values through activities which are acceptable to the youth.

How is Rover/Ranger Scouting pursued?

- 1. Training in forest Art in order to develop the habits of supervision, submissiveness, self-confidence and self-reliance.
- 2. Training to enable him to be considerate to all and sincerity and service for others.
- 3. Learning useful service to self and the community.
- 4. Developing the physical and mental faculties by doing exercises in useful social contacts.

5. Guiding to develop social and spiritual values through personal contact and precepts.

Programme is Rover/Ranger Scouting

- 1. National Training Centre and National adventure institute of Panchami (M.P) is Mecca for Rover Scouts and Ranger Guides where a Rover/Ranger tries to imbibe all the values in lap of nature through various activities.
- 2. Uparashtrapati Award Competition is held every year only for the Rovers/Rangers.
- 3. There are many states, National and International Level activities in which Rovers/Rangers can participate.
- 4. Different kinds of Rover/Ranger activities are held every year at various levels.
