



COLLEGE PROFILE

Attendance:

Each P.G &U.G course (Theory, Practical etc...) shall be treated as an independent unit for the purpose of attendance. A student shall attend a minimum of 75% of the total instruction hours in a course including tutorial and seminars in each semester. There shall be no provision for condonation of shortage of attendance and a student who fails to secure 75% attendance in a course shall be required to repeat that course to accrue the credit.

Master of social work-MSW:

Candidates who have passed any Bachelor degree examination of Mangalore University or any other considered as equivalent thereto are eligible for the programme provided, they have secured a minimum of 45% (40% for SC/ST/ Category-I candidates) marks in optionals.

Master of Commerce -M.Com :

Candidates who have passed the three year B.Com/B.B.M/B.B.A degree examination of Mangalore University or any other University considered as equivalent thereto are eligible for the Programme provided, they have obtained not less than 45% (40% for SC/ST/ Category-I candidates) marks in aggregate in the all subjects excluding languages and group III subjects.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION :

The College is imparting instructions to various courses through ENGLISH MEDIUM. However, for the benefit of the weak students, remedial classes and tutorials are conducted.

LIBRARY :

The College Library has good collection of books on various subjects taught in the College and reference books, various journals, periodicals & magazines are subscribed to the library for the general reading.

ADMISSION :

- 1. The College is a co-educational institution.
- 2. Admissions are made on the basis of marks obtained by the candidates in the qualifying examinations. The rules of the University and the Government are strictly followed in this regard.
- 3. Admissions are made on the clear understanding that those who are admitted would abide by the rules and the regulations of the college.
- 4. Admissions to any course are made for one academic year only. Students will have to submit fresh applications for admission to the higher class. This is made in view of counseling the students for improving their academic standards in the forthcoming year.
- 5. All admissions made in the college are provisional and they are subject to the approval of the Mangalore University,
- 6. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student without assigning any reason.
- 7. All payment to and from the college are governed by the rules of Mangalore University / Government of Karnataka.
- 8. The fees once paid will not be refunded except under the specific order of the University.
- 9. Three passport size photos shall be submitted at the time of admission.
- 10. Candidates with 60% or more marks in the II PUC I commerce opting to join B.Com/BBA course in the college, can take up optionally CA/CPT/CS Training.

FEE REGULATIONS :

The Tuition and Special fees for the academic year are payable in one lumpsum at the time of admission or re-admission. Every student shall be liable to pay the fee of the entire term, if his/her name is on the rolls during any part of the term.All payments to the College office shall be made during the Banking hours

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. For day to day behavior every student of the College is responsible to the Principal.
- 2. Students are expected to be in Uniform etiquette with College I.D. while attending classes, meeting or College function.
- 3. The working day is divided into two sessions. The forenoon session falls between at 9-00 am and 1-00 p.m. and the afternoon session between 2-00 p.m. & 5-00 p.m.
- 4. Due respect to the members of the staff of the college should be given by the students at all times.
- 5. Though the college is not responsible for the conduct of its students outside the premises, the Principal will take cognizance of any serious misconduct of the students outside which is likely to reflect upon the reputation of the College and take such action against the offender as he may deem fit and proper.
- 6. Books, Magazines, Newspapers and Pamphlets which are not approved by the Principal should not be brought to the College.
- 7. Students should not join such associations which may interface with their studies, without the Principal's permission.
- 8. Students of the College are not allowed to play in any external team against the College without prior permission of the Principal.
- 9. Silence must be strictly maintained not only in the Class rooms but also in the Library, Reading room & Corridors.
- 10. No student is allowed to attend any class other than his/her own except with the prior permission of the Lecturer concerned.
- 11. Irregularity in attendance, disobedience towards Staff, neglect of work, habitual in attention, obscenity in word or act are punishable by temporary or permanent dismissal.
- 12. The use of tobacco in any form and the use of intoxicating drinks is forbidden besides, the sale of cigarette or tobacco products within 100 yards of the college premises is prohibited. If they are sold it is a punishable offence.
- 13. Students should participate in the co-curricular and extra curricular activities of the College.
- 14. Students are not allowed to take part in political agitations directed against the authority or Government. They are also forbidden from engaging in any public movement.
- 15. In academic matters, the rules and regulations framed by the Principal and the College Governing Council from time to time shall have to be strictly adhered to

by the students of the College.

- 16. No meeting or party should be held in the College premises without the prior approval of the principal.
- 17. Absence for college examinations and class tests will be seriously dealt with.
- 18. In curricular studies, assignment are compulsory and every student has to maintain the assignment records in each of the subject of study and submit the assignment records as and when demanded by the Principal or the lecturer concerned.
- 19. Disfiguring walls, tables, desks, benches etc., is strictly prohibited and are punishable with heavy penalty.
- 20. Willful damages to the property of the College, books, electric appliances/ instruments etc. will have to be paid for by the students of the class concerned. The decision of the Principal is final in this matters.
- 21. No Student is allowed to enter or leave the class without the permission of the Lecturer concerned.
- 22. Students must take care that their entry or exit which does not disturb the classes.
- 23. Students are not allowed to organize picnics or tours on their own. However, they will be allowed to conduct picnic or tours with prior permission of the Principal.
- 24. 75% attendance in each subject is compulsory for getting the eligibility to write the university examination.
- 25. Students enrolled in NCC/NSS/Rovers& Rangers/Youth Red Cross wing: are instructed to follow the uniform Dress code; etiquette of the respective wing compulsory.
- 26. Letters addressed to the students of the College are subject to the scrutiny of the Principal if necessary.
- 27. Driving the vehicles in the College premises during the working hours is strictly prohibited.
- 28. Students are always welcome to approach the Principal or any member of the staff for any help connected with the Academic matters or otherwise. They shall not, however, enter the Principal's Chamber/Office or the Departments without permission.
- 29. Parents/Guardians of the students are advised to keep vigil over their children, wards and maintain healthy relationship with the Institution.
- 30. Purity and sanctity of the College atmosphere are to be maintained by every inmate of the college. Students should not invite any outsider to the College functions without the prior permission of the Principal.

- 31. Students are not allowed to loiter in the premises of the College during working hours. Each and every activity of the students should be up to the standard of academic decorum and dignity.
- 32. At the stroke of second bell the students must assemble in the concerned classes and observe the prayer. When the Lecturer enters the classroom at the stroke of third bell, the students should raise and remain standing till he/ she asks to sit.
- 33. When the attendance is taken by the Lecturer, each student whose name or roll number is called must raise from his/her seat and respond to his/her name.
- 34. Parents or Guardians, relatives or friends of the students are not allowed to meet when the classes are in progress.
- 35. Those students who abstain from the classes continuously for 3 classes without the permission of the Principal will not be permitted to attend the classes unless they meet the Principal with their Parent/Gurdain.
- 36. Ban of cell phones : Use of cell phone by students in the college campus is banned. Cell phones, if found with the students will be confiscated. Student should not play audio/ visual devices in the campus. If found the devices will be confiscated.
- 37. Ban of 4 Wheelers : Those students who come to the college by two wheelers should have a valid license and insurance cover. To avoid noise pollution and disturbance, vehicles should be fitted with silencers. Students should park their vehicles only in the place allotted for them. Bringing four wheelers to the college by studentsis prohibited.

Ragging Student will be Expelled

Verdict of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on Ragging Incidents:

"Hence forth in every prospectus relating to admission of the students in any Educational Institution, it shall be clearly stated that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory the authority would expel him/ her from the institution".

STUDENT COUNCIL

The student Council of the College is formed by the Principal in consultation with the Student Welfare officer and the Staff members in charge of the various Associations.

LIBRARY

- 1. The College Library is kept open on all working days from 9-00 am to 5-00 pm
- 2. Strict silence is to be maintained in the Library.
- 3. The books borrowed from the library can be kept only for one week.
- 4. Sub-lending of books is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Any damages to the books which are in the borrower's custody will have to be made good and if a book is lost, the current price of the book with prescribed penalty should be paid.
- 6. A fine of Rupee One per day per book is charged for the books returned after the due date.
- 7. If the due date falls on holiday, the book is to be returned on the following day.
- 8. The books issued to the student may be recalled at any time.
- 9. OPAC has been introduced and the students are requested to make full use of it.
- 10. If you have any clarification or doubts, consult the Librarian who will be happy to guide you.

GENERAL

The working hours of the College are as follows.

Forenoon : 9-00 am to 1-00 pm.

Afternoon : 2-00 pm to 5-00 pm

- 1. Special classes may be held beyond the prescribed working hours, if necessary.
- 2. Students coming late should not enter the classes without the permission of the Lecturer concerned.
- 3. Attendance is taken at the beginning of each period. A student who is not in the class at the commencement of each period will be marked absent for that period.
- 4. Attendance at special classes which may be conducted by the Lecturer is compulsory. Attendance at such classes will be recorded by the Lecturer concerned.
- 5. A student requiring leave for a class should apply for in person to the concerned Lecturer well before the commencement of the Lecture.

6. A student should obtain 75% of attendance in each subject during the academic year, failing which he/she will not be allowed to appear for the examinations.

COLLEGE TESTS AND EXAMINATION

Attendance is compulsory for all internal examinations conducted by the college at regular intervals.

In each Semester, two internal exam will be conducted. First internal exam will be of 1 hour duration and 2nd internal exam will be 2 hours duration.

IIDENTITY CARD

Every student must possess identity card issued by the College. It should be brought to the College every day. Identity card should be properly preserved and retained throughout the academic career of the student.

GAMES, SPORTS AND MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS

Students should properly make use of Sports & Games facilities provided by the College. During the class hours, no indoor/outdoor games will be permitted. Every student shall undergo Medical Examination every year without fail.

FOUNDER'S DAY

26th December is the birthday of the Founder President Dr. Kurunji Vanktramana Gowda. This day will be celebrated as the Founder's day.

DRESS CODE

All the students are required to abide by the dress code of the College whenever they are on the campus. During vacation/revision holidays also college uniform is compulsory to visit the Library/Office/Principals chamber/Staff room etc.

MEN :

- College Uniform should be stitched as per the prescribed stitching pattern.
- Shirts should be in the formal style (half sleeves only) without any designs or trendy cuts.
- Trousers should be in the formal style : full length, straight cut, single fleet and not in baggy, cargo, low-waist, pencil/ carrot cut or in any other style.
- The shirts should be inserted. The belts, if used, should be of leather. Formal in style and black in color.
- Tattoos, ear-rings, pigtails, awkward bracelets, headgears, cow boyish/gypsy appearance. visors, sunglasses etc., are banned.
- Hair styles must be formal-neat, tidy, organized and well groomed. Hair coloring, gelling is not allowed.
- Moustaches are allowed, but hair may not extend beyond the edges of the lips, nor may it extend beyond the top of the upper lip
- Beard should be neatly shaved. All types of beard and moustache designs are prohibited.
- Hiking boots, cowboy boots and gaudy coloured footwear are banned.
- Any trendy dress & shawls / strolls are not allowed.


WOMEN : (Salwar Kameez)

- College Uniform should be stitched as per the prescribed stitching pattern.
- Tops should be round in 'Nehru collar' style. Deep neck and long slit patterns are banned.
- The tops should be of three quarter sleeves with a band of the chudi-pant material (with a small slit where the sleeve ends).
- Pants should be formal.
- Coloring of hair, piercing of body for studding etc., are not allowed.
- Tattoos, mehandi on the arms or coloring's are not allowed.
- Being bedecked in huge jewelry-genuine or imitative should be avoided.
- Acceptable footwear include : pumps, peep toe,open toe dress shoes, closed and open toe sling backs, open back heels, clogs, loafers, deck shoes, non-athletic walking shoes, dress boots and flats.
- Students are allowed to wear only one color of uniform.


